Weebacarry Update

Aurora Minerals recent scout drilling program at its Weebacarry Project in Western Australia resulted in the completion of 1704m of RAB drilling and 2101m of aircore drilling on 6 lines at 300m to 800m spacing between lines. All of the holes were drilled at a bearing of $-60^{\circ}/135^{\circ}$ magnetic. The majority of the drilling was undertaken at 60m centres along the lines.

The project is part of the Aurora Minerals – Hampton Hill Mining NL joint venture under which Aurora is earning a 51% interest.

The focus of the exploration was the projected northerly extension of the Miss Jane mineralization (refer map) and the general trend of mineralization and geochemical anomalism which extends for approximately 3km to the south.

The logged geology is similar to that of the first RAB program in 2006 and includes significant amounts of quartz veining.

Assay laboratory results are expected in the next 2 to 4 weeks.

Other Projects

Aurora is pleased to report that this week it has acquired a further ten exploration licences applications at its Capricorn project in Western Australia to cover the projected south east extension of the major regional Talga Fault, recently identified by the Geological Survey of Western Australia, towards the Jeealia Fault (refer map).

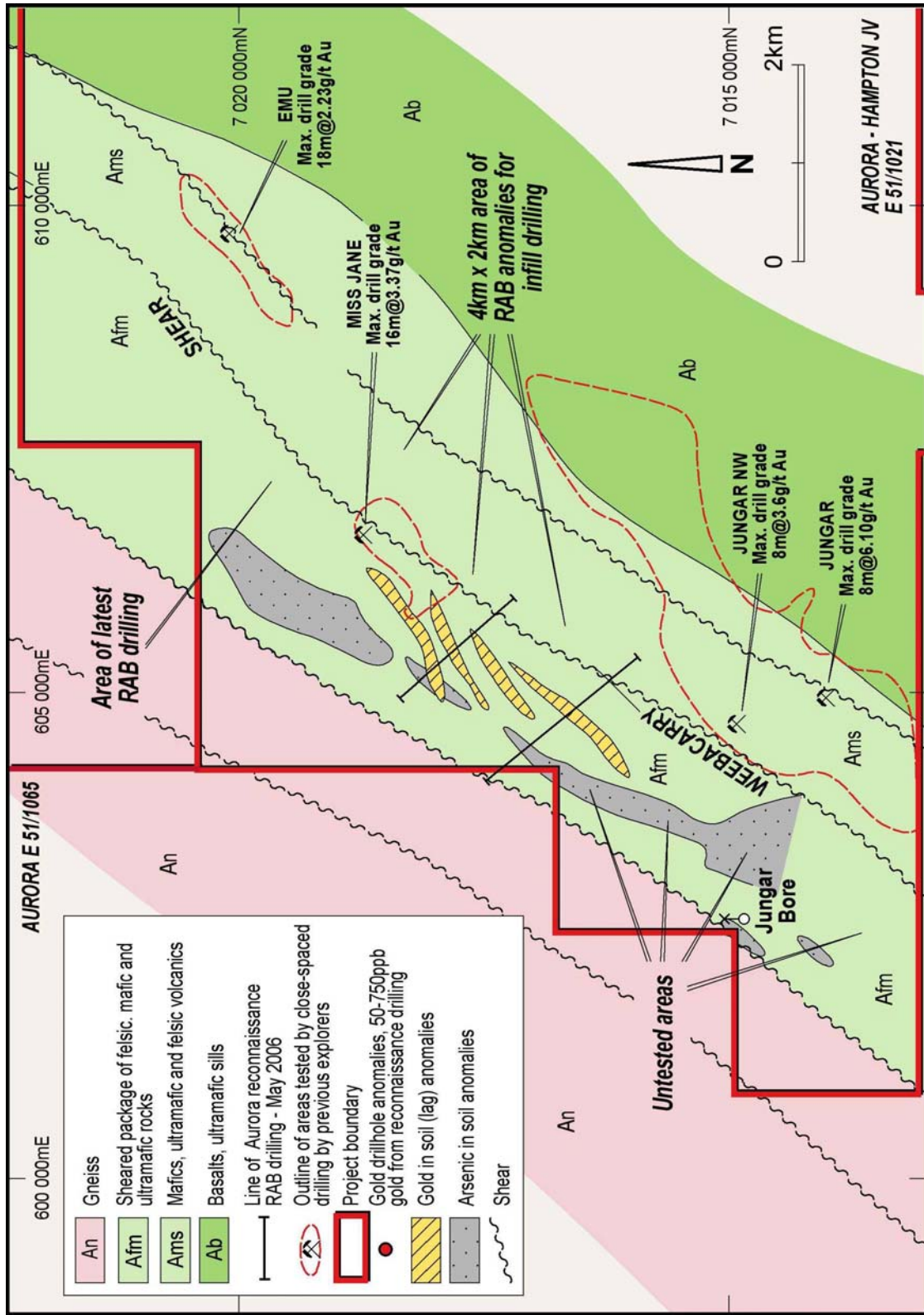
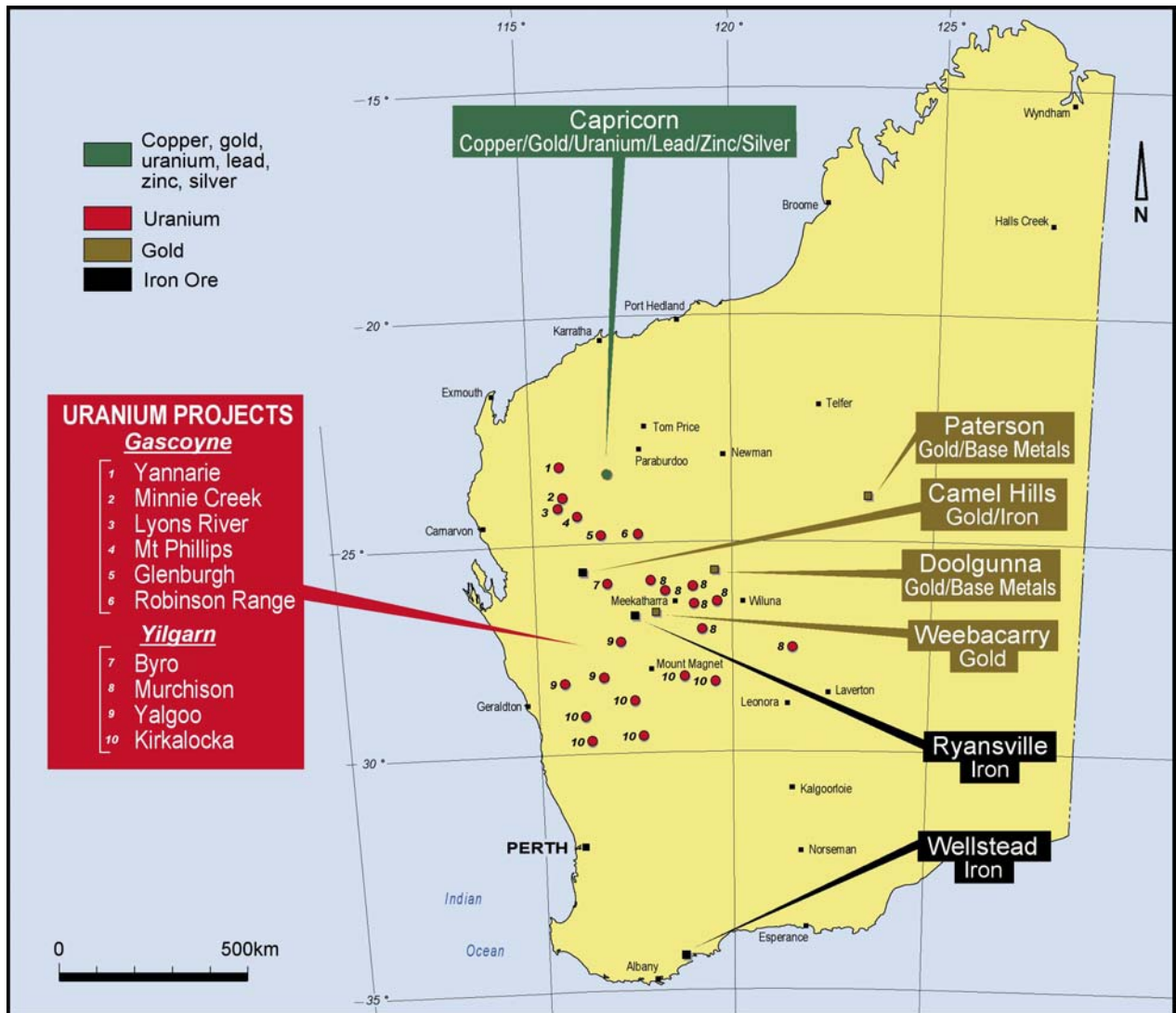
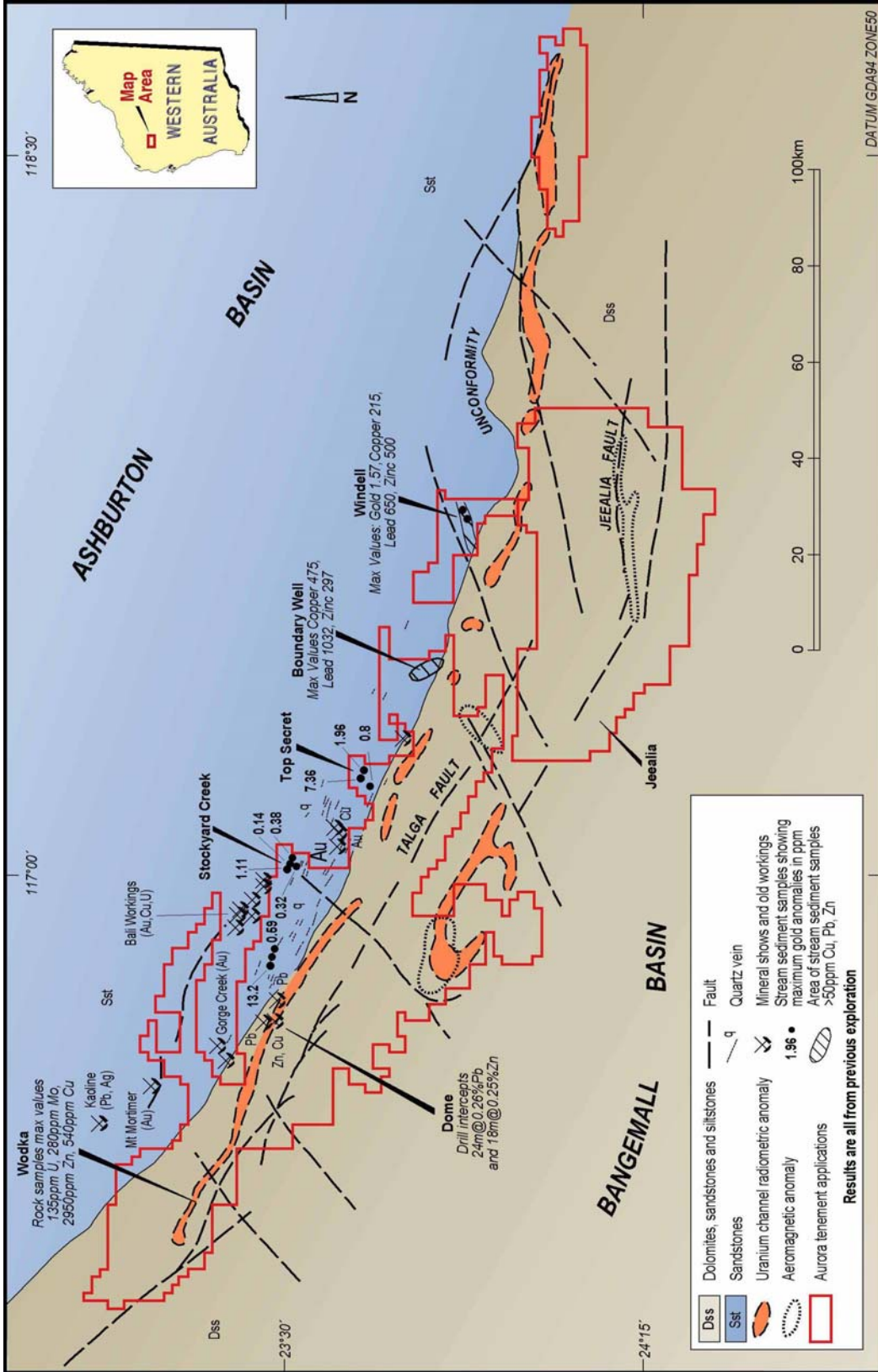
